<u>Gauber Bunk Barn</u> <u>Information about your stay</u>

-Our water supply comes from a nearby borehole. The water is tested annually by Craven District Council and is safe to drink. If you would prefer to drink bottled water we do have bottles available for purchase.

Our water passes through a UV filtration system. At times, (usually after heavy rainfall) the filters can become blocked and cause a drop in water pressure. Please let us know as soon as possible if you notice a drop in water pressure and we will change the filter, it takes 2 minutes!

-We do not have any provision for camping at Gauber.

- A septic tank collects waste from the barn and Den. Please do not put any products other than toilet paper down the toilet.

-Gauber Bunk Barn is an old building. Some of the stairs in the barn are uneven and some of the doorways are quite low.

-All of the bunk beds are designed to sleep adults and children, however the top bunks are not suitable for children under the age of 6 years. The maximum weight for each bunk bed is 17 stones.

- Fitted sheets, pillows and pillowcases are provided. Guests are welcome to bring their own sleeping bags/duvets and towels, alternatively duvets and towels are available to hire.

-A travel cot and high chair are available on request. Please bring your own bedding for the cot bed.

-A maximum of 2 well behaved dogs are welcome in the bunk barn. A charge per dog per stay does apply.

-There is a Smart TV in the living room.

-Free Wi-Fi is available however due to our rural location it can be intermittent at times.

-There is no mobile signal in the immediate area.

-The kitchen is equipped with a double oven, 4 ring electric hob, microwave oven, fridge/freezer, kettle, toaster, dishwasher and washing machine. Cutlery, crockery, pots, pans and serving dishes are all available for guests to use.

- A starter pack of logs/kindling and coal is included in the price. Additional logs etc.. are available to buy on-site, please ask.

A starter pack of toilet rolls, kitchen roll, hand wash, washing up liquid and dish washer tablets are provided.

Tea towels, dish cloth and hand towels are also provided.

-We have a drying room/bike store available for guests to use.

-We have an area of free parking outside the barn and Den. Please consider other guests when parking and please do not park in the area marked 'Den Parking' or on the grass area, thank you.

Additional vehicles can be parked in the large lay-by just a couple of minutes walk from Gauber.

-We do not have a provision for charging electric cars at Gauber. The nearest EV charging station is in the Community Centre car park, Ingleton.

-The nearest pub, the Station Inn, Ribblehead ,Tel 01524 241274 is a 15 min road walk from Gauber. Please be aware there is no path or street lighting.

-There are a number of restaurants, takeaways and pubs in Ingleton (15 min drive from Gauber). Unfortunately none of the local takeaway restaurants deliver to Ribblehead. If you would prefer to bring your own food the barn has a well equipped kitchen. During the summer months we have a BBQ available for guests to use in the garden to the rear of the barn(charcoal is not provided).

-If you wish to make an online grocery order Tesco, Asda, Sainbury's and Morrisons deliver to this area. When giving directions please instruct them we are on the B6479 and not at Salt Lake Cottages! We have a clear Gauber Bunk Barn sign on the grass verge. Please ask them to deliver to the bunk barn, not the farmhouse.

-Gauber Bunk Barn & Den are in a rural location. The nearest shops can be found in Ingleton(15 min drive from Gauber). There are a number of small shops including a Co-op, petrol station, pharmacy, outdoor wear shop, gift shops and a number of restaurants, pubs and takeaways.
